

Dr. Panayiotis Baltatzis was born in Xanthi, Greece, in 1951, to Pontian Greek parents. He completed his secondary education in Thessaloniki and went on to graduate from the Medical School of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki.

In 1977, Dr. Baltatzis emigrated to the United States, where he completed his residency in Internal Medicine in Baltimore, Maryland. He subsequently practiced Internal Medicine in Baltimore for thirty-one years, serving his patients with dedication, professionalism, and quiet distinction.

Beyond his medical career, Dr. Baltatzis has been deeply involved in the life of the Greek-American community. He currently serves as First Vice President of the Hellenic American National Council. He has also served as Vice President of the Pan-Macedonian Association of America and as President of the Maryland chapter of the Hellenic Society PAIDEIA.

A man of learning, service, and humility, Dr. Baltatzis has devoted much of his life not only to medicine, but also to the preservation of Hellenic identity, history, language, and culture in the diaspora.
