

George Harvalias is a journalist and political analyst specializing in geostrategic affairs, and the author of the bestselling book *Jawohl! Blood, Oblivion and Subjection – German Dominance in Europe. The Bitter Greek Experience*.

Born in Athens, he graduated from Moraitis School before pursuing undergraduate studies in Economics at the University of Athens. He continued his academic formation in the United Kingdom, earning a Master's degree in Comparative Politics from the University of Kent and a second Master's degree in War Studies from King's College London.

He began his journalistic career in the 1990s at *Eleftheros Typos* and later served as an international affairs analyst for the Greek state broadcaster (ERT), covering major diplomatic conferences and international developments, with extensive reporting assignments in the Balkans.

In 1999, he left his position as Editor in Chief at *Eleftheros Typos* to join *Ethnos Athens Daily*. Over the next decade, he rose to become Director of both the daily and Sunday editions. In 2010, he resigned rather than endorse the policy of mass layoffs and downsizing adopted under Greece's bailout program.

Today, George Harvalias writes for the newspaper *Dimokratia* and serves as a strategic consultant on geopolitical and international affairs.
